



### ECOLINT LEARNER PASSPORT

Learning doesn't only happen in classrooms. The Learner Passport shines a light on students' growth in creativity, collaboration, global citizenship, and resilience, wherever and however that learning takes place.

### What We've Achieved

- > Over **400 graduates** have now received the Learner Passport alongside their diploma, with both a digital and physical version included in their graduation folder.
- > The platform's academic section is being strengthened, with every subject from **Years 10–13** mapped to provide a richer, more comprehensive transcript.
- > Schools are embedding the Learner Passport into daily practice: guidance counsellors are

aligning it with student support, and new students now receive an introductory package with their Heads of Year.

> We are finalising a **formal partnership** with the International Schools Association, a significant milestone in positioning the Learner Passport as a global standard for recognising student achievement beyond traditional academics.

### **Expanding Global Reach**

In the coming months, we are preparing a customised Learner Passport for Cempaka International School (Malaysia). This pilot, developed as part of our agreement with the International Schools Association (ISA), could pave the way for adoption across many schools within this global network.







# GOING SOLAR: TOWARDS A 100% RENEWABLE ENERGY CAMPUS

La Grande Boissière has set an ambitious goal: to become a 100% renewable energy campus by 2030. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we have taken a significant step toward achieving this vision.

An important sustainability project at the Primary School has led to the installation of over 460 new solar panels, which are expected to generate more than 185,000 kWh of renewable energy each year. This additional electricity will be shared across the entire campus, further reducing our carbon footprint and supporting our commitment to environmental stewardship.

With this expansion, our solar infrastructure continues to grow beyond the 1,402 existing panels, which already produce around 30% of the campus's energy needs. These collective efforts demonstrate how our community's support can drive meaningful change – for our students and for the planet.

### TEACHER DEVELOPMENT FUND

Thanks to the generous contributions to the Teacher Development Fund, we have been able to offer impactful professional learning opportunities that directly strengthen teaching and leadership across our community.

At La Châtaigneraie for example, all Primary Year Leads took part in a full-day workshop focused on middle-level leadership and team dynamics. This engaging session helped team leaders enhance collaboration, communication, and collective efficacy, reinforcing the strong culture of teamwork within our school.

In the area of Digital Learning and Fluency, the Fund has opened doors to new and forward-looking initiatives. Staff were invited to reflect on the opportunities, challenges, and ethics of Artificial Intelligence,

exploring both the potential and the responsibilities that come with integrating AI into education.

In addition, one teacher is currently pursuing the Middle Leader Certificate: AI & Digital Fluency, further advancing our school's expertise at the intersection of leadership and emerging technologies.



### BURSARY FUND

Today, many of our families are facing an uncertain future as a result of significant reductions in UN and related international organisations. In true Ecolint spirit, parents, alumni, and friends of the school have come together to support our Bursary Fund, helping to ensure that financial challenges do not disrupt a child's education or sense of belonging.


Thanks to this collective generosity, twenty students have been able to remain part of the Ecolint community, continuing their learning, friendships, and contributions to school life. This act of solidarity reflects the very values on which Ecolint was founded: compassion, inclusion, and a deep commitment to one another in our community.

# ENHANCING SPORTS SCIENCE AND GYMNASTICS

The Sports Department at La Grande Boissière benefited from philanthropic support, enabling the purchase of a high tech stationary bike and a specialized gymnastics mat.

The new bike is being used to support a range of laboratory investigations in both the Year 11 International Baccalaureate (IB) Preparation Course and the Year 12 and 13 IB Sport Science courses. These lab sessions are essential for helping students connect theoretical knowledge to real-world sporting applications, and the bike has proven to be an invaluable tool in enhancing their learning experience.

The gymnastics mat has allowed students to develop correct techniques for working on a sprung floor, while providing the extra support needed to build confidence and progress safely. It has been particularly beneficial for younger and lighter students, whose lower body weight makes it more challenging to fully utilise the sprung floor's mechanisms.



From an early age, he was captivated by the power of visual storytelling, and during his time at Ecolint he spent countless weekends behind the camera, collaborating with friends to bring imaginative stories to life. Whether filming short sketches or experimenting with editing techniques, Dima approached each project with focus and creativity. His dedication was not just a hobby—it was a clear sign of a future in the film industry.



This unwavering commitment has now opened an exciting new chapter in his journey. Dima has been awarded a scholarship to study Film Production at DePaul University in Chicago, a testament to both his talent and perseverance. We are incredibly proud of all he has achieved and confident that with his vision and drive, Dima will go on to craft powerful stories that inspire and connect audiences around the world.

"College is going exceptionally well for me. I've made many new friends and feel that I'm doing well academically. I absolutely love Chicago and enjoy taking small adventures to explore the city and its people. Over the next three weekends, I'll be on set as a Second Assistant Director for one film project by an upperclassman and as an Assistant Producer for another. I think that's incredibly exciting."

### **Programme overview**

The Ecolint Scholarship Programme continues to create transformative opportunities for exceptional students from diverse and often underrepresented backgrounds. To date, the programme has awarded scholarships to 21 students from 10 countries, including 16 with refugee status. These scholars enrich the life of our school community both inside and outside the classroom, embodying resilience, curiosity, and ambition.

### **Student Achievements and Opportunities**

Our scholars have taken on leadership roles and embraced a wide range of enriching opportunities across all campuses.

### This year's highlights include:

- Active participation in student councils, the Rainbow Club, the Anti-Discrimination Committee, and the Ecolint Olympics
- Engagement in sports teams, the school band, the theatre tech crew, and a self-defence course
- Completion of a universitylevel MOOC in Sustainable Management from the University of Manchester
- Acceptance into the highly competitive Villars Institute Ecopreneur Programme
- Participation in local and international trips, including Strasbourg, Chamonix, ski excursions, and volleyball tournaments
- Recognition for excellence, with two scholars receiving effort prizes — selected from among more than 170 students per year group.
