Hosting Regulations and Behaviour Guidelines

The International School of Geneva sincerely hopes that you will enjoy this year's **Students' League of Nations**. As everyone wants this to be a positive experience for all participants, and for the families who have kindly agreed to act as hosts, we have drawn up the following guidelines.

Visiting students remain under the authority of their school at all times. This applies to all activities, irrespective of location, undertaken during the period of the Conference. It is the responsibility of accompanying adults to ensure that students respect instructions given to them by members of the S.L.N. Steering Committee, U.N.O. staff and host parents.

Smoking, or any other use of tobacco, drinking alcohol and the use of drugs are not permitted at any time. Visiting students are requested not to bring alcohol to their host family as a gift of appreciation.

Housing arrangements made by the host school may not be changed. Special diet requirements (e.g. vegetarian) must be notified before the arrival of the student(s) in the host family.

Please remember that many of our host families will have children who will be attending school and parents who have to make an early start to their places of work.

All visiting students should ensure they have emergency contact numbers, for their school representative and hosting family, with them at all times. It is also recommended that visiting students and staff subscribe to personal travel insurance.

All participants are reminded that they are expected to dress soberly and smartly for the General Assembly. Delegates are further reminded that all mobiles, smartphones, laptops etc: must be switched off during speeches and debates.

Participants are reminded to be polite and respectful at all times. Inappropriate behaviour can result in immediate and permanent exclusion from the General Assembly.

These regulations apply to all students throughout the duration of the Conference.

We hope you enjoy your visit to Geneva and we very much look forward to welcoming you all here.
