

BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

We offer a wide range of opportunities to students, both within and outside school hours, supplementing the school's already rich educational programme. These activities cover many areas: sporting, academic, cultural, and more. In many cases they draw on the close links that the school has with the many international organisations situated within a short walking distance of the campus.

A selection of activities which take place throughout the year:

SPORTS

School teams participate in local, national and international activities in a wide range of sporting events at different levels, and also the "Course de l'Escalade" in Geneva.

Large numbers of students participate in the school's recreational sports. We run an Outdoor Education programme for Years 5 through 12 which includes seasonal trips along with a day Ski Programme in Years 2-6.

Currently, we offer the International Award at Bronze, Silver and Gold level.

SPORTS+ Programme – Aimed at top-level student athletes who want to succeed both academically and athletically. SPORTS+ is suitable for students of all ages, whatever their sport.

SPORTS+ is the first student-centred programme offered in an international school that supports both the athletic and the academic dimensions.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Extra-Curricular Activities include swimming, choir, ballet, art club, karate, judo, football, basketball, athletics, band, a coding club and a comprehensive range of musical instruments. During the summer holidays we offer camps with many exciting activities. The "World Languages Programme" provides mother tongue tuition in more than 20 different languages and has the ability to provide others as necessary.

THEATRE, MUSIC, ART AND CULTURE

Year 13 IB Diploma Art Exhibition.

Within the Extra-Curricular Activities, students can join the ENCORE Performing Arts Academy and the Music School, both designed to enhance creative expression and skill development.

ENCORE offers professional-level training in the performing arts and offers programs in dance, drama, and LAMDA qualifications.

The Music School offers private lessons, music theory, ensemble participation, and Ecolint Orchestra concert opportunities for students of all ages and skill levels.

STUDENT CONFERENCES, DEBATES

Students take part in the following events:

CAMPUS DES NATIONS

Campus des Nations is the most recent campus of the International School of Geneva. Opened in 2005, it welcomes around 1,000 students representing more than 100 nationalities.

Campus des Nations comprises two sites near the United Nations office: Pregny (opposite the US Mission) and Saconnex (between the World Council of Churches, the International Labour Organisation and the World Health Organisation).

With modern buildings in the heart of Geneva's international quarter, this campus has quickly established itself as an educationally pioneering school committed to putting student learning at the centre of all its activities. Campus des Nations is proud to be an International Baccalaureate World School. Our programmes are based on the IB's "Learner Profile", a set of ideals that inspire, motivate and focus the work of the school and help students to become more thoughtful, principled, cultured and caring. Fostering these qualities is at the heart of all we do.

WHY CHOOSE CAMPUS DES NATIONS?

This is the only International School of Geneva campus and only school in Geneva that offers all four International Baccalaureate programmes. It provides a wholly integrated educational experience in which key themes are constantly reinforced. Beginning with an innovative inquiry-based **Primary Years Programme (PYP)**, students move on to the **Middle Years Programme (MYP)**, and then into the **International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (DP)** at age 16. The **IB Career-related Programme (CP)** is available as an alternative to the IB Diploma for students who prefer a practical, career-focused approach to learning.

Being surrounded by international organisations, we are able to bring to school influential speakers who are themselves grappling with the complex issues that shape our modern world.

The campus' primary language of instruction is English, while some students also have the opportunity to learn through French, with up to 40% of classes offered in French from Year 4 to Year 9 and up to 25% from Year 10 to Year 13. Within our multilingual learning environment, students are encouraged to achieve proficiency in both English and French while maintaining and celebrating their home languages. French learning is supported through structured pathways, including tailored language classes and enrichment programmes. Students requiring support for English language acquisition have sessions with specialist teachers.

We are an inclusive school and have Extended Support Programmes for children with moderate to severe learning needs taught by specialised staff. There are specific staff/student ratios, admissions criteria and procedures for entry to the ESP.

Our dedicated team of Heads of Year, Mentors, and Psychologists ensures comprehensive support for child's socio-emotional development and wellbeing.

Campus des Nations provides a high quality After School Care service for Early Years and Primary students from Pre-Reception to Year 6 and there is an extensive selection of Extra-Curricular Activities every day of the week.

The International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme (PYP) is designed for children ages 3 to 11 and builds on the natural development of the child. Children learn through 4 to 6 units of inquiry covering a broad range of concepts of global importance intended to develop internationally minded students. The holistic programme your child will follow is designed to develop academic understanding as well as to foster social, emotional, and physical development, and cultural awareness.

Pre-Reception to Year 3 (Pregny site)

At Pregny, we welcome children aged 3 to 8 in our Pre-Reception to Year 3 classes. In our Pre-Reception, Reception and Year 1 classes, children learn in an environment where teachers speak a combination of English and French throughout the day. In Years 2 to 3, children attend French lessons with specialist teachers in small groups designed to meet their individual language needs, whether they are at a beginner level or French is their dominant language. If children do not have English as their dominant language, they are assessed when they join us and receive extra support as part of our English as an Additional Language (EAL) programme.

Year 3 to Year 6 (Saconnex site)

From the age of 8 your child will join our Upper Primary section at Saconnex and continue with the **International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme (PYP)**.

The Primary Programme has a dual language approach to learning. Although the majority of the teaching is in English, students also have access to certain classes taught in French. This allows them to both learn specific language skills and to explore classroom themes through the French language. The students have access to a range of anglophone and francophone resources in their classrooms and the school library as well as books in many of the home languages spoken by our students.

In Year 6, your children carry out an extended project called the PYP Exhibition, through which students, teachers and families work collaboratively. The PYP Exhibition is an important transition for your child from the PYP to the Middle Years Programme (MYP).



In the **International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (MYP)**, students aged 11–16 develop as independent, internationally-minded learners, gaining the knowledge and skills to connect their learning to the world around them.


The programme offers an integrated approach across eight subject groups: Language and Literature, Languages of Acquisition, Mathematics, Sciences, Design, Physical and Health Education, Individuals and Societies, and the Arts, and uses global contexts to connect learning to real-world issues. Together, these subjects provide a broad, balanced, and engaging education.

Students in Years 7, 8, and 9 who are proficient in French may study Mathematics, Sciences, and Individuals and Societies through French, while the use of French is also encouraged in other subjects, including the Arts and Physical and Health Education.

The MYP emphasises independent, lifelong learning through its Approaches to Learning (ATL), which help students develop transferable skills that support learning across all subjects.

Community engagement is integral, with students participating in local and global service initiatives that foster creativity, critical thinking, and reflection.

In Year 11, students complete a Personal Project, a sustained, self-directed inquiry set within a global context. The programme culminates in the school's MYP Certificate, accompanied by the Ecolint Learner Passport, recognising each student's achievements and skills across the curriculum.



Your child has the opportunity to follow two different **International Baccalaureate** pathways.

Diploma Programme (DP)

Apart from its reputation as a school-leaving diploma of extraordinary breadth, quality and international academic currency, the DP at Campus des Nations has original features that exemplify the school's philosophy including a bespoke pastoral programme and physical education.

The DP, assessed through a variety of tasks and submitted coursework, culminates with written examinations that take place in May of Year 13. If your child does not follow the full DP, they can work towards DP certificates in



a range of subjects and/or complete the High School Diploma.

Career-related Programme (CP)




A dedicated team of University Counselors work with students to ensure acceptance to prestigious universities around the world.
