We offer a wide range of opportunities to students, both within and outside school hours, supplementing the school's already rich educational programme. These activities cover many areas: sporting, academic, cultural. In many cases they draw on the close links that the school has with the many international organisations situated within a short walking distance of the campus.

A SELECTION OF ACTIVITIES WHICH TAKE PLACE THROUGHOUT THE YEAR:

SPORTS

School teams participate in local, national and international activities in a wide range of sporting events at different levels, and also the "Course de l'Escalade" in Geneva.

Large numbers of students participate in the school's recreational sports. We run an Outdoor Education programme for Years 5 through 11 which includes two seasonal trips along with a Ski Programme in Years 1-6.

Currently, we offer the International Award at Bronze, Silver and Gold level.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE AND EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Extracurricular activities include swimming, choir, ballet, art club, karate, judo, football, basketball, athletics, band, a coding club and a comprehensive range of musical instruments. During the summer holidays we offer camps with many exciting activities. The "Mother Tongue Programme" provides mother tongue tuition in 15 different languages and has the ability to provide others as necessary.

CAMPUS DES NATIONS

Campus des Nations is the most recent campus of the International School of Geneva. Opened in 2005, it welcomes around 1,000 students representing more than 110 nationalities.

Campus des Nations comprises two sites near the United Nations office: Pregny (opposite the US Mission) and Saconnex (between the World Council of Churches, the International Labour Organisation and the World Health Organisation).

With modern buildings in the heart of Geneva's international quarter, this campus has quickly established itself as an educationally pioneering school committed to putting student learning at the centre of all its activities. Campus des Nations is proud to be an International Baccalaureate World School. Our programmes are based on the IB's "Learner Profile", a set of ideals that inspire, motivate and focus the work of the school and help students to become more thoughtful, principled, cultured and caring. Fostering these qualities is at the heart of all we do.

WHY CHOOSE CAMPUS DES NATIONS ?

This is the only International School of Geneva campus and only school in Geneva that offers all four International Baccalaureate programmes. It provides a wholly integrated educational experience in which key themes are constantly reinforced. Beginning with an innovative inquiry-based Primary Years Programme (PYP), students move on to the Middle Years Programme (MYP), and then into the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (DP) at age 16. The IB Career Related Programme (CP) is available as an alternative to the IB Diploma for students who wish to follow a more career-related education.

Our staff is enthusiastic about creating links between the community and school. Being surrounded by international organisations, we are able to bring to school influential speakers who are themselves grappling with the complex issues that shape our modern world.

The campus' language of instruction is English. However, we maintain a strong emphasis on developing all students' French to a high level and we aim to ensure that French is offered to our students throughout their education. Applications are welcomed from francophone families wishing a predominantly English-language education for their children. In the Years 7 to 9 it is possible for families to choose the amount of curriculum their children receive in French. Mathematics, Science and Individuals and Societies are offered in French. Therefore, parents have flexibility in choosing the amount of exposure to French their children experience.

We are an inclusive school and have Extended Support Programmes for children with moderate to severe learning needs taught by specialised staff. There are specific staff/student ratios, admissions criteria and procedures for entry to the ESP.

Campus des Nations provides a high quality After School Care service for Early Years and Primary students from Pre-Reception to Year 6 and there is an extensive selection of Extra Curricular Activities every day of the week.

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The International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme (PYP) is designed for children ages 3 to 11 and builds on the natural curiosity of the child. Children participate in 4 to 6 units of inquiry covering a broad range of concepts of global importance intended to develop internationally minded students. The programme your child will follow is designed to foster the development of the whole child by focusing on social, physical, emotional and cultural, as well as academic needs.

Pre-Reception to Year 2 (Pregny site)

In our Early Years school at Pregny we welcome children ages 3 to 7 in our Pre-reception through to Year 2 classes. In our Pre-reception and Reception classes, children learn in an environment where teachers and classroom assistants speak a combination of English and French throughout the day. In Years 1 and 2, children attend French lessons with specialist teachers in small groups designed to meet their individual language needs, whether they are at a beginner level or French is their mother tongue. If children do not have English as their mother tongue, they are assessed when they join us and may receive extra support as part of our English as an Additional Language (EAL) programme.

From the age of 7 your child will join our primary section at Saconnex and continue with the Primary Years Programme (PYP) until they are 11 years old.

In Year 6 your child will carry out an extended project called the PYP Exhibition, through which students, teachers and families work collaboratively. The PYP Exhibition is an important transition for your child from the PYP to the Middle Years Programme (MYP).

The primary programme has a dual language approach to learning. Although the majority of the teaching is in English, many of our classes are complemented by the presence of a francophone teaching assistant. The students also have French language lessons each week. The French language lessons allow for students to learn specific language skills as well as explore the classroom curricular focus through French instruction. The students have access to a range of anglophone and francophone resources in their classrooms and the school library as well as books in many of the mother tongues spoken by our students. Visual arts are taught in French, further developing natural acquisition of our local language.



Your child will study within the framework of the **International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (MYP)** from ages 11-16. The programme develops active learners and internationally-minded young people encouraging students to make practical connections between their studies and the real world.

An integrated approach to teaching and learning is provided by global contexts through eight subject groups: Language and Literature, Languages of Acquisition (foreign languages), Mathematics, Sciences, Design, Physical and Health Education, Individuals and Societies and the Arts (visual and performing). These provide a broad and balanced education.

Students can access the dual language programme (CLIL) in Years 7, 8 and 9 according to language level and ability in the following subject groups: Sciences, Mathematics and Individuals and Societies. Use of the French language is encouraged in some subjects, notably Visual Arts and Physical and Health Education.



We aim to teach your child to become an independent life-long learner through the approaches to learning (learning how to learn) that provide students with transferable skills.

Service as action is an integral part of the programme in which students engage in community service, making a positive difference to the lives of others and the environment. At the local level the emphasis is on working with the host country. Globally students become involved in a wide range of issues. Together with their academic work students become creative, critical and reflective thinkers.

In the final year of the programme (Year 11) your child will complete a Personal Project, a sustained, self-directed inquiry within a global context. Students also experience the world of work through an internship. All the elements of the programme culminate in the school's IB Middle Years Programme certificate accompanied by an International School of Geneva Universal Learning Passport.

Your child has the opportunity to follow the **International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (DP)** from Year 12 to Year 13. Apart from its reputation as a school-leaving diploma of extraordinary breadth, quality and international academic currency, the DP at Campus des Nations has original features that exemplify the school's philosophy including an extended Theory of Knowledge course, "Global Affairs" debating sessions and compulsory physical education.

The DP, assessed through a variety of tasks and submitted coursework, culminates with written examinations that take place in May of Year 13. If your child does not follow the full DP, they can work towards DP certificates in

a range of subjects, complete the High School Diploma, or chose to follow the CP programme (see below).

Our students of both DP and CP programmes have excellent university admission success rates.

The International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme (CP) offers students at the Campus des Nations an opportunity to specialise in creative industries or business while continuing to pursue the kind of holistic education which you would expect to receive at Ecolint. This exciting International Baccalaureate course combines Diploma subjects with a BTEC qualification allowing students to focus on their areas of interest



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
