INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL OF GENEVA, CAMPUS DE LA CHÂTAIGNERAIE

SCHOOL & COMMUNITY: La Châtaigneraie is one of the three campuses of the International School of Geneva in Switzerland. Founded in 1924 on principles of global peace and in the service of the League of Nations, 'Ecolint' is an independent non-profit foundation with an elected governing board which includes representatives from the cantonal and federal authorities, and the United Nations. The world's first international school, Ecolint remains its oldest and largest. It co-founded the International Baccalaureate in 1968 and remains at the forefront of educational dynamism (developing new IB courses, for example). Ecolint educates the children of international and Swiss families in the greater Geneva area, providing instruction in both English and French. There are 1035 students in La Châtaigneraie's secondary programme with approximately 80 nationalities represented. For many, English or French is not their first language. Students are admitted on a non-selective, first-come, first-served basis and 95% of graduates go on to higher education. COVID: Ecolint was in lockdown from March 13th until the end of the school year. Lessons for all students continued online. Internal exams also took place online.

ACCREDITATION: La Châtaigneraie is accredited by the Council of International Schools (CIS) and the Middle States Association (MSA). It is a founding member of the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) and a member of the European Council of International Schools (ECIS) and the Swiss Group of International Schools (SGIS).

FACULTY & FACILITIES: The 100 teachers and learning support staff are drawn from all parts of the world with well over a dozen nationalities represented, including but not limited to Australian, American, British, Canadian, Chinese, Dutch, French, German, Indian, Irish, Italian, Japanese, Trinidadian, Spanish, and Swiss. The ratio of staff to students is 1:10 in the secondary section. Facilities include three main buildings, twelve science and computer labs, a large library, a theatre, performing arts studios, art studios, two sports halls, a gym, playing fields and an artificial pitch.

CURRICULUM UK Years 7-13 / US Grades 6-12:

Years 10-13 follow a rigorous university preparatory curriculum. This leads to external IGCSE or internal examinations at the end of Year 11, a high school diploma at the end of Year 12, or the IB Diploma, IB Courses, or Swiss Maturité at the end of Year 13. The curriculum includes integrated science in Years 7-9, Physics, Biology, and Chemistry in Years 10-11, and IB Biology, Chemistry, and Physics in Years 12-13. Three years of language other than English and French are required to graduate: Spanish, German and Italian are offered, plus many mother tongue courses. Social Sciences include Geography and History in Years 7-13 with the addition of Economics plus Business and Management in Years 12-13. Computer Programming, Video Editing, Web Design, Visual Arts, Music, and Theatre Arts are available as internally or externally examined courses across Years 7-13. La Châtaigneraie has been a laptop school since 2015.

International Baccalaureate Programme (Years 12-13): Subjects offered (by IB group) include: (1&2) English, French, German, Spanish (plus many mother tongues); (3) Business & Management, Economics, Geography, History; (4) Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Environmental Systems & Societies, Nature of Science (an IB pilot course), Physics; (5) Mathematics (all levels); (6) Music, Theatre Arts, and Visual Arts.

Swiss Maturité Programme (Years 10-13): Approximately 10% of students choose to follow this francophone programme with examinations at the end of Years 12 and 13. A very broad range of subjects are included and students are able to complete a bilingual French-English Maturité programme if they so wish. We can provide a concise document explaining the Swiss Maturité, including how to convert scores to IB points.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES: Interscholastic and intramural sports, drama club (offering LAMDA qualifications and ISTA competitions), debating club, printed and online newspapers, elected student council, peer counselling, Student League of Nations, Amnesty International, Global Issues Network, and the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award. Many student council activities are social service projects for and in developing countries.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: 24 credits (minimum), including 4 in the mother tongue (usually French or English); 3 in another language; 3 in laboratory science; 3 in mathematics; 3 in social sciences; 1.5 in aesthetics (art, music, and/or theatre, in any combination); 1.5 in physical education; and 5 from elective courses.

GRADING & DISCIPLINARY Policy: Only year-end grades are transcripted. Students are graded on a scale of 1 to 7 in IB courses and on a scale of 1 to 6 in Swiss Maturité courses. Marking standards are very rigorous. Students are elected to the Honour Roll in the IB programme with a 6 average and to the Excellence Roll with a 6.5 average; for the Swiss Maturité programme, a 5 elects to the Honour Roll and a 5.5 to the Excellence Roll. GPAs are not weighted and there is no ranking. Any disciplinary actions including suspensions are only reported to US colleges and universities if the probationary period is active at the time of application. We believe that error leads to learning, and so we strongly encourage students to report any serious disciplinary infractions on their application forms.
