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The Campus des Nations is one of the three campuses of the International School of Geneva, an independent non-profit foundation with a Governing Board. This Governing Board includes representatives from the Federal, Cantonal and City authorities. In pursuance of its mission, the school educates children of Swiss and international families in the greater Geneva area. Instruction is provided in both French and English. Founded in 1924 shortly after the establishment of the League of Nations in Geneva, the school's mission is to prepare an international student body of over 130 nationalities and 90 mother tongues to enter universities in many countries around the world. The International School of Geneva was the main agent in creating the International Baccalaureate (IB) programme. The school is accredited both by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and by the Council of International Schools (CIS). Students are admitted on a non-selective, first-come/first-served basis. Over 95 per cent of graduates proceed each year to higher education.

> GRADING

Class Rank The school has a transient student population. Some students remain for only one or two years. This does not allow for the compilation of a meaningful class rank based on GPA. There is therefore no class ranking.

Grading System Students are graded on a scale of 7. The grades are not weighted. GPA calculations are based solely on grades earned at the school and do not include non-academic courses such as Physical Education and non-IB Art. The minimum passing grade is 3. Physical Education is graded on a Pass/Fail basis

> ACADEMICS

International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (MYP) The subjects on offer are: Language and Literature (English/French), Language Acquisition (French/Spanish), Mathematics, Sciences (Biology/Chemistry/Physics), Individuals and Societies (History/Geography/International Relations), Design, Arts (Visual Arts/Theatre/Music/Film), and Physical and Health Education. The externally moderated Personal Project, which involves at least 25 hours of independent learning, does not attract credit for the HSD.

International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) The IBDP forms the basis of all courses in Years 12 and 13/Grades 11 and 12. The subjects on offer at Higher (HL) or Standard Level (SL) are: ENGLISH HL English Literature / SL English Language and Literature, MATHEMATICS HL Mathematics / SL Mathematics, Math Studies, SCIENCES HL/SL Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Design Technology, Nature of Science, FRENCH HL/SL French A/B Language and Literature / SL French B (ab initio), SPANISH HL/SL Spanish B, OTHER LANGUAGES self-taught mother tongues (ST), SOCIAL SCIENCES HL/SL Economics, Psychology, History (in English or French), Geography, ARTS HL/SL Film, Visual Arts, Theatre.

International Baccalaureate Career-Related Programme (IBCP) The IBCP includes a BTEC Level 3 (QCF) 60-, 90- or 120-credit diploma in either Business or Art and Design (<http://qualifications.pearson.com/en/about-us/qualification-brands/btec.html>), modules within the Careers Course, and at least two (maximum four) IBDP subjects at HL/SL as above. Successful completion of the IBCP yields an HSD.

High School Diploma (HSD) 24 credits with the following minimum credits in each subject: Mother tongue language (4), second language (3), Mathematics (3), Sciences (3), Humanities (3), Visual Arts/Music/Theatre/Design (1.5) and Physical Education (1.5).
